

# Missouri Stream Team Program

The Missouri Stream Team Program is made up of citizen volunteers with an interest in, and passion for, Missouri streams. Its mission is promoting citizen awareness and involvement in river and stream conservation. The program provides comprehensive science-based education and training in water quality monitoring and supports team efforts to promote stewardship of streams and rivers. The Program was established in 1989 and is supported by the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC), the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR), and the Conservation Federation of Missouri (CFM).

## Paddle Mo

Stream Teams United established Paddle MO in September of 2016 as an annual five-day, 100-mile recreational and educational journey on the last 100 miles of the Missouri River. The purpose of the event is to connect people to the Missouri River and to the 115,000 miles of flowing water in The Great Rivers State. just as the legislative session was concluding, a Senate Resolution (SCR 17) passed, gifting Missouri a new state slogan: "The Great Rivers State." This resolution highlights one of our greatest ecologic and economic resources. Stream Teams United supports The Great Rivers State slogan through promotions that include a specialty license plate available through the Missouri Department of Revenue. All Missourians who care about water resources are invited to show their love for Missouri rivers and streams by ordering and showcasing a Great Rivers State license plate.

# Stream Data Summary Reports

The Volunteer Water Quality Monitoring Program began in 1993 and since that time thousands of Stream Team volunteers have been trained to collect water quality samples from Missouri streams. In 2011, the first data summary report was completed, which compiled and analyzed the volunteer data from 1993-2010. The 2018 report adds an additional six years of data and includes analysis of water chemistry samples at 627 sites and macroinvertebrate monitoring at 413 sites across the state. The results are summarized and interpreted for each of 13 regions of the state. In total, the report compiles and summarizes data from over 40,000 sampling events.





### This Week in #Mowater

Bulletins are distributed to over 6,000 email addresses, including announcements of Stream Team and Association events and news about water resources across the United States. During the Missouri legislative session, bulletins include the Legislative Lookout with information about bills of interest to Stream Teams, including notification of public hearings. ## Missouri Clean Marina

The Missouri Clean Marina program is a voluntary, incentive-based program that encourages marina operators and recreational boaters to protect water quality by engaging in environmentally sound operating and maintenance procedures. The goal of this program is to improve and protect the water quality of



Missouri lakes. Marina and boating industries depend on clean water for their continued success. Becoming a Missouri Clean Marina allows the marina to publicly demonstrate they are takina actions in being good stewards of their lake.
